the result is a provocative and absorbing history of the united states new york times for a country that has always denied having dreams of empire the united states owns a lot of overseas territory

this vividly detailed revisionist history opens a new vista on the great ottoman empire in the early nineteenth century a key period often seen as the eve of tanzimat westernizing reforms and the beginning of three distinct histories ethnic nationalism in the balkans imperial modernization from istanbul and european colonialism in the middle east christine philliou brilliantly shines a new light on imperial crisis and change in the 1820s and 1830s by unearthing the life of one man stephanos vogorides 1780 1859 was part of a network of christian elites known phanariots institutionally excluded from power yet intimately bound up with ottoman governance by tracing the contours of the wide ranging networks crossing ethnic religious and institutional boundaries in which the phanariots moved philliou provides a unique view of ottoman power and ultimately of the ottoman legacies in the middle east and balkans today what emerges is a wide angled analysis of governance

as a lived experience at a moment in which there was no clear blueprint for power

poulomi saha offers an innovative account of women s political labor in east bengal over more than a century through a material account of text and textile an empire of touch crafts a new narrative of gendered political labor under empire

in 221 bce the state of qin vanquished its rivals and established the first empire on chinese soil starting a millennium long imperial age in chinese history hailed by some and maligned by many qin has long been an enigma in this pathbreaking study the authors integrate textual sources with newly available archeological and paleographic materials providing a boldly novel picture of qin s cultural and political trajectory its evolving institutions and its religion its place in china s history and the reasons for its success and for its ultimate collapse

the emperor is dead long live the empire general bordan has a lifetime of duty and sacrifice behind him in the service of the empire but with rebellion brewing in the countryside and assassins thieves and politicians vying for power in the city it is all bordan can do to protect the heir to the throne apprentice magician kyron is assigned to the late emperor s honour guard escorting his body on the long road back to the capital mistrusted and feared by his own people even a magician s power may fail when enemies emerge from the forests for whoever is in control of the emperor s body controls the succession seven lives and seven deaths to seal the fate of the empire

my goal is to show the reader that the soviet political and economic system was unstable by its very nature it was just a question of when and how it would collapse from the introduction to collapse of an empire the soviet union was an empire in many senses of the word a vast mix of far flung regions and accidental citizens by way of conquest or annexation typical of such empires it was built on shaky foundations that instability made its demise inevitable asserts yegor gaidar former prime minister of russia and architect of the shock therapy economic reforms of the 1990s yet a growing desire to return to the glory days of empire is pushing today s russia backward into many of the same traps that made the soviet union untenable in this important new book gaidar clearly illustrates why russian nostalgia for empire is dangerous and ill fated dreams of returning to another era are illusory attempts to do so will lead to defeat gaidar uses world history the soviet experience and economic analysis to demonstrate why swimming against this tide of history would be a huge mistake the ussr sowed the seeds of its own economic destruction and gaidar worries that russia is repeating some of those mistakes once again for example the nation is putting too many eggs into one basket leaving the nation vulnerable to fluctuations in the energy market the soviets had used revenues from energy sales to prop up struggling sectors such as agriculture which was so thoroughly ravaged by hyperindustrialization that the soviet union became a net importer of food when oil prices dropped in the 1980s that revenue stream diminished and dependent sectors suffered heavily although strategies requiring austerity or sacrifice can be politically difficult russia needs to prepare for such downturns and restrain spending during prosperous times collapse of an empire shows why it is imperative to fix the roof before it starts to rain and why so

superb the best one volume economic history of the united states in a long time and perhaps ever newsweek in this illuminating history john steele gordon tells the extraordinary story of the world s first economic superpower he shows how the american economy became not only the world s largest but also its most dynamic and innovative combining its english political inheritance with its diverse ambitious population the nation was able to develop more wealth for more and more people as it grew far from a guaranteed success america s economy suffered near constant adversity it survived a profound recession after the revolution an unwise decision by andrew jackson that left the country without a central bank for nearly eighty years and the disastrous great depression of the 1930s yet having weathered those trials the economy became vital enough to americanize the world in recent decades virtually every major development in technology in the twentieth century originated in the united states and as the products of those technologies traveled around the globe the result was a subtle peaceful and pervasive spread of american culture and perspective

this is the story of how the city was saved by notker the professional liar written down because eventually the truth always seeps through the city may be under siege but everyone still has to make a living take notker the acclaimed playwright actor and impresario nobody works harder even when he s not working thankfully it turns out that people appreciate an evening at the theatre even when there are large rocks falling out of the sky but notker is a man of many talents and all the world is apparently a stage it seems that the empire needs him or someone who looks a lot like him for a role that will call for the performance of a lifetime at least it will guarantee fame fortune and immortality if it doesn t kill him first this is the story of notker an occasionally good man and a terrible liar with razor sharp prose and ferocious wit k j parker has created one of fantasy s greatest heroes and he might even get away with it

cormack demonstrates that geography was part of the arts curriculum between 1580 and 1620 read at university by a broad range of soon to be political economic and religious leaders by teaching these young englishmen to view their country in a global context and to see england playing a major role on that stage geography helped develop a set of shared assumptions about the feasibility and desirability of an english empire

in rome global dreams and the international origins of an empire sarah davies explores how the roman republic evolved in ideological terms into an empire without end this work stands out within roman imperialism studies by placing a distinct emphasis on the role of international level norms and concepts in shaping roman imperium using a combination of literary epigraphic and numismatic evidence davies highlights three major factors in this process first is the development in the third and second centuries bee of a self aware international community with a cosmopolitan vision of a single universalizing world system second is the misalignment of rome s polity and concomitant diplomatic practices with those of its hellenistic contemporaries and third is contemporary historiography which inserted rome into a cyclical and cosmic rise and fall of great power

in 264 bc a roman army was poised to cross from southern italy into sicily they couldn t know that this crossing would be rome s first step on its journey from local republic to vast and powerful empire at the beginning of the three dramatic centuries that make up this book s narrative rome had no emperor and limited global influence by the book s end hadrian was set to pass into history as one of the greatest emperors whose territories stretched from england to turkey in david potter s masterful history of this period we trace the process of cultural political and civic transformation which led to the creation of a monarchy and the acquisition of territory via wars with hannibal the destruction of carthage augustan empire building and hadrian s famous wall all of which contributed to the most successful multi cultural state in the history of europe this is a lively scholarly approach to an essential era

the establishment of the indian national congress in 1885 marked a turning point in modern south asian history at the time few grasped the significance of the event nor understood the power that its leader would come to wield from humble beginnings the congress led by gandhi would go on to spearhead india s fight for independence from british rule in 1947 it succeeded the british raj as the regional ruling power ian copland provides both a narrative and analysis of the process by which indians and pakistanis emancipated themselves from the seemingly iron clad yoke of british imperialism in so doing he goes to the heart of what sets modern india apart from most other countries in the region its vigorous democracy
